Exams:

You must have a picture identification (i.e. Student ID or Drivers License) to take an exam. Failure to have an ID will result in a grade penalty. When the test time is over you must turn in your test immediately. If your name and/or answers are not filled out on the scantron by the end of the test time, 5 points will be taken off your test grade. Once the final call for turning in tests takes place, 5 points will be deducted for each minute the test is late.

Final Exam:

The FINAL EXAM is Comprehensive. The final exam is a departmental final. That means that all ACCT 2100 students take the same final exam at the same time. This exam takes precedence over other exams if there is a conflict. The final exam for all sections of Acct 2100 counts 40% of the course grade. The room in which you take the final will be announced in class and will be different than the room where the class has met all semester.

Test Make-ups:

Make-up exams will not be given! If something comes up that causes you to miss a test (athletic event, illness, death in the family, court date, car trouble, etc.), the final exam will receive greater weight by counting as the grade for the missed exam. The final exam can only replace one missed test. If you miss two tests, one of them will be a "0".

HW, Quizzes,

Homework will be due when we finish each chapter. Paper copies of homework will not be accepted. You will have multiple attempts for the online homework. Only your highest grade will count. The homework must go up and come down for everyone at the same time, there are no individual extensions. Do not wait until the due date to try to complete the homework. There may be in class unannounced quizzes which would count as bonus points added to your total points.

Missed Classes:

Everyone has emergencies. Emergencies include illnesses, family illnesses, death in the family, car trouble, computer problems, oversleeping, and all other reasons for not attending class or getting assignments turned in on time. If you miss a class, it is your responsibility to get the notes from someone in class and find out about any upcoming assignments. Late homework is not accepted and make up quizzes are not given.
