Course Description: MUS 1900 0 cr. – Recital Hour gives students an opportunity to present performances in front of a supportive audience of peers. It also gives music students an opportunity to come together as a unit. Recital Hour attendance helps students to become active listeners in a live setting and also to experience a wide range of different musical styles. *All music majors are expected to enroll in and to pass Recital Hour every semester of attendance.

Course Goal:

The purpose of this course is to provide music students a forum to hear music performed by peers and also to provide an opportunity for individual performance.

Course Requirements and Grading Policy:

All students enrolled in MUS 1900 must complete the following requirements:

- 1) Enroll in and pass Recital Hour every semester of attendance.
- 2) Attend a minimum of 10 concerts on the UNO campus. The course is pass/fail. If you do not attend and enter 10 concert reports into Moodle, you will not pass the course.
- 3) All students should include at least some attendances at the scheduled Recital Hour time.
- 4) Enter each attendance into Moodle in a timely manner with a minimum of 25 word descriptions per submission.
 - a. When submitting your attendance reports you are required to include when and where the event was held, who performed, and what was on the program. Also write a short paragraph about the music and your experience at the concert
- 5) Students normally cannot count concerts in which they perform. Exceptions must be approved by the Chair.
- 6) All completed entries must be submitted into Moodle no later than midnight on Friday, December 11th. NO EXCEPTIONS!
- 7) All students in lessons are encouraged to perform at least once a year.
- 8) All students are expected to pass each semester or risk not graduating.
- 9) Transfer students are responsible for enrolling in recital hour beginning with their first semester of enrollment at UNO and must pass every semester or risk not graduating.
