Abstract

The proposed public history project, *La Fièvre Jaune*, will be one component of a larger exhibit sponsored by the Archdiocese of New Orleans, Office of Archives and Records entitled *Song of Farewell: Catholic Cemeteries of New Orleans*, focusing on New Orleans's historic Catholic cemeteries, funeral chapels, relics, and burial rights. Using cemetery and death records, *La Fièvre Jaune* documents many of the Catholic, largely Irish immigrants struck by yellow fever in 1853 and the role of St. Patrick's cemetery as the burial site for this population. The epidemic took the lives of some 8,000 people. This project will provide insight into the ways that the Catholic Church in New Orleans responded to the 1853 yellow fever epidemic using photographs, official correspondence, as well as cemetery and death records. The entire exhibit will be housed at the Old Ursuline Convent Museum in the French Quarter.

Project Overview

Drawing upon Catholic cemetery records overlooked by many historians, *La Fièvre Jaune* documents the effects of the yellow fever epidemic of 1853 on the Catholic immigrant population of New Orleans. The epidemic, one of the city's worst, struck New Orleans in May of 1853, taking the lives of some 8,000 residents, many of them newly arrived Irish immigrants of the Catholic faith. The exhibit will focus primarily on the Irish immigrants buried in St. Patrick Cemetery No. 1. It will also make available and easily searchable, for the first time, the names of those who died of the fever and were buried in St. Patrick's cemetery, located northwest of the French Quarter on Canal Street. [See Appendix] The exhibit space will supplement these records and the stories they contain with archival visual material and excerpts from firsthand accounts.

La Fièvre Jaune is the first such project to draw upon the records of St. Patrick's

Cemetery. It is significant that the St. Patrick No. 1 cemetery records are the only cemetery records for that time period that state the cause of death. Yet because the records are incomplete—most likely because records keepers had difficulty keeping pace with the large number of deaths in such a short period—historians have largely overlooked them as a source for information about the outbreak. Nonetheless, there is still much that can be gleaned from the St. Patrick's cemetery records at the Archdiocese of New Orleans, including racial, ethnic, and demographic information about the deceased, the rate of death according to age and gender, and the extent of the responsibilities of Catholic clergy and officials to the Irish immigrant community.

Historical Context

Global History of Yellow Fever

Yellow fever's spread to the Americas is a product of Atlantic slavery and global trade. The yellow fever virus is spread by *Aedes aegypti*, a specific type of mosquito of West African descent, known as *A. aegypti*. Today, the disease is still affecting parts of South America and Africa, with Central America, South America, and sub-Saharan Africa most affected. The majority of twenty-first-century cases occur in sub-Saharan Africa because of the poor sanitary conditions there. In 2018, the World Health Organization reported that "thirty-two African countries are now considered at risk of yellow fever, with a total population of 610 million people, among which more than 219 million live in urban settings." As populations grow, sanitary conditions deteriorate, and the disease re-emerges in other areas of the world. Today, yellow fever kills 30,000 people globally each year and is still a serious public health issue in many cities and towns around the world. Yellow fever remains an important aspect of history, but it is crucial to remember that these epidemics are not merely something of the past.

The first documented case of yellow fever in the Western Hemisphere, a consequence of the trade in African people to the Caribbean, occurred in Barbados in 1647.⁴ During the late 1600s, yellow fever was sporadic throughout the Caribbean. For instance, historians recount the death of colonial troops on the island of St. Lucia: "In 1665, a British squadron noted to be in good health, seized St. Lucia. A garrison of fifteen hundred troops placed on the island was

quickly reduced to eighty-nine by an epidemic of yellow fever."⁵ The disease was exported from the Caribbean with cases of rum and sugar. In 1693, yellow fever arrived in British North

America and struck Boston.⁶

During the next hundred years, yellow fever epidemics struck port cities up and down the East Coast of North America. Though its occurrence was usually random, there were two instances when the fever made annual visits. According to historians Pierce and Writer, "Starting in 1737, eastern seaports suffered through seven consecutive yellow fever summers and then were yellow fever-free until 1762. Between 1762 and 1765, yellow fever returned each year to North American cities. It then disappeared for nearly three decades." The next devastating epidemic occurred in Philadelphia in 1793 and brought in the deadliest line of yellow fever epidemics on record. Philadelphia suffered the greatest loss during the annual yellow fever epidemics that lasted for a total of thirteen years. Philadelphia was a large, populated port city with thousands of immigrants. It was a result of a continuous stream of migrants from elsewhere in the United States and foreign immigrants into the city. By the 1820s, the fever was seen mostly in the South and would ravage people there until the early twentieth century and the updating of sanitary conditions.

"The Stanger's Disease" in New Orleans

From the earliest outbreaks in New Orleans, it was noticeable that the fever mainly affected the immigrant populations of the city. The first known case of yellow fever in New

Orleans came during Spanish rule in 1769, killing at least 350 people. This incident frightened many residents out of the city and those who could afford it fled to more rural areas. Jo Ann Carrigan has written that "It was generally believed that the 'unacclimated stranger' was more susceptible to yellow fever than the native simply because he was not yet accustomed to the climate and hence not yet resistant to diseases associated with the climate." This belief would be a common assumption throughout numerous epidemics to follow. Newspapers recorded the difference in survival rates between city residents who had been infected by the disease previously and so-called "strangers" to New Orleans.

The epidemic in 1853,in fact, began with the death of a "stranger"—a sailor from the ship, *Augusta*, who died at Charity Hospital within three days from the disease. The ship had made its way into the port of New Orleans alongside a ship from Kingston, Jamaica, the *Camboden Castle*, which had many previous reports of yellow fever on board when leaving Jamaica. Through the next few days, many other reports of yellow fever from the *Augusta* came into Charity Hospital. Dr. Erasmus Darwin Fenner, a witness to the epidemic, pointed to these as the first cases of the 1853 epidemic in the city, although physicians disputed whether or not the early cases *were* due to yellow fever: "The first cases that appear are generally more or less defective in what are considered characteristic symptoms, and hence the doubts and disputes that so often arise," wrote Fenner. 11

The death toll during yellow fever outbreaks varied. Some years, the presence of the fever caused little disruption to the city. In other years, such as 1853, the epidemic caused great commotion among residents. The yellow fever epidemic of 1853 was one of the worst epidemics in the city's history. The official death toll released by the city totaled almost 8,000. (The city's final yellow fever epidemic in 1905 seems to have had a more moderate death toll, though no official number was recorded.) Because the 1853 epidemic occurred from May until August, during some of New Orleans's hottest summer months, the city's humid weather conditions helped to breed the disease. The New York Daily Times wrote that on Sunday, August 23, "The number of internments [burials] for the twenty-four hours ending this morning was 148, including 124 who died of yellow fever." The article followed the city through the next few days of August mentioning, on the morning of Wednesday, August 21: "The reports of interments have not been completed for some days past, owing to a difficulty about the Catholic Cemetery. The yellow fever deaths reported this morning were about 120."13 Although it is not stated which Catholic Cemetery they are referring to, it is quite possible that they are referring to St. Louis Cemeteries or St. Patrick Cemetery No. 1. The amount of dead per day between May and September caused an overflow of the dead who needed to be buried. With the overwhelming number of bodies, it was almost impossible to know an accurate number of the deceased on any particular day.

Two of the most affected neighborhoods of New Orleans were what became known in later decades as "the Irish Channel" (upriver from the French Quarter) and the densely populated

Quarter itself.¹⁴ These areas had the worst sanitary conditions in the city and were fertile breeding ground for *A. aegypti* mosquitos. The immigrants living in the Irish Channel suffered with some of the worst conditions. As historian Robert Reinders described it: "The enclave was filthy, city by deep ruts, lined on each side with a narrow strip of water and bordered with low one-story, framed-built dwellings whose roofs were old, covered with moss, jutting over the footpaths - and doors and windows of solid timber, never open, that impart to the whole, a gloomy appearance."¹⁵ The filthiness of the streets in the area are just the beginning to the epidemic. As the summer went on, the conditions grew even worse.

The nature of the work performed by many Irish immigrants made them especially vulnerable to contracting the fever. Irish men frequently took jobs digging canals and therefore exposed to standing water. Many of these men also worked in the maritime trade, exposing them to yellow fever epidemics arriving on ships.. The first case of an Irishman seen by Dr. Fenner was James McGuigan, age of 26 years. It is recounted that he had been sick four days and was last in Liverpool.¹⁶

Catholic Cemeteries and Yellow Fever

The history of St. Patrick's Church and its cemetery are inextricable from the history of Irish immigration to New Orleans. St. Patrick's is the second-oldest church in New Orleans, second only to St. Louis Cathedral. Although church officials recognized the need for such a cemetery in the 1840s, with the influx of Irish fleeing the potato famine, it was the 1853

epidemic which gave St. Patrick No. 1 its distinct shape because of the rapid death rate among the Irish immigrant population. According to The Cultural Landscape Foundation:

...expedient burials in [St. Patrick No.1] during the 1853 yellow fever outbreak are evident not only in the multitude of tombstones bearing that date, but also in the haphazard, random arrangement of the graves. St. Patrick Nos. 2 and 3 are across Canal Street and run parallel to Canal Boulevard. They follow a more formal layout, with tombs ordered in long rows that flank the central walkway, with slender strips of grass filling in the interstitial spaces between rows. The chronology of the sections serves to document the integration of New Orleans' Irish community: while the family names in St. Patrick No. 1 are almost exclusively Irish, there is increasing variation in Nos. 2 and 3, as Italian, French, and English names appear alongside Irish ones. 17

During the many epidemics that affected New Orleans, the church and the government tried their best to protect their citizens and to rid the city of disease. One of the ways was through the placement of the cemeteries in the city. As New Orleans grew, so did its cemeteries. As disease and epidemics consumed the city, the Church and the local government continued to build cemeteries outside of the city to help protect citizens and parishioners. St. Patrick Cemetery was established far from the St. Patrick Church and the city's center in order to keep diseases from spreading.

Another way that the church and local officials tried to defend the city was by building a mortuary chapel at the edge of the French Quarter, which at that time was the city center. St. Anthony's Mortuary Chapel or the Old Mortuary Chapel, was built in 1826 as a burial church for the victims of yellow fever. Located in front of the St. Louis Cemetery No. 1, the dead would have their last rights given to them in the mortuary chapel before being were moved into the cemetery. Having the rights given here and not at their neighborhood church decreased the contact between diseased bodies and the public. Officials hoped this might decrease the chance of the dead infecting other citizens.

Review of Literature

Yellow fever was a global phenomenon in the nineteenth century. R. S. Bray's work, Armies of Pestilence: Impact of Disease on History (1996) describes the history of yellow fever's impact on the world. Bray attributes the origin of the disease to monkeys from South and Central American, the Caribbean, and southern African forests. The disease then spread to man in Africa and through ports and rivers into the Americas and Europe, sparking epidemics in many cities, including Philadelphia and New Orleans. Bray focuses, mainly, on the effects of yellow fever in the United States but does not include any information on burial traditions or the impact of yellow fever on burials. A study of yellow-fever burials, or lack thereof, may add to the literature.

The passing of yellow fever from the Northeast to the Southern states, and specifically to Louisiana, reflected growing modernization efforts in cities such as Boston and New York which were unmatched by their southern counterparts. Jo Ann Carrigan's *The Saffron Scourge: A History of Yellow Fever in Louisiana, 1796 – 1905* (1994) traces the various outbreaks of yellow fever that affected the state, focusing on the similarities and differences of various outbreaks. Carrigan analyzes the social and cultural impact of yellow fever and chronicles the appearance of yellow fever and its gradual spread through trade and travel routes, highlighting major epidemic years. She analyzes theories about its origin and proposed routes, medical treatment, and social, political, and economic consequences. In her discussion of New Orleans's 1853 yellow fever epidemic, Carrigan focuses on the city's major demographics among its neighborhoods, including the effects on the Irish and German immigrant communities. ¹⁸ Carrigan's scholarship provides important context for the growing immigrant population and the sanitary, social, and

economic conditions of New Orleans during the epidemic. Although her work is beneficial to the study of these immigrant communities, Carrigan does not examine the role of the Catholic Church during the epidemic. While she does mention burials, it is brief, and mixed among a general overview of the conditions and situations placed on New Orleanians.

One of the most important practices during the yellow fever epidemics became the medical practices of the physicians of that time period. In *Sword of Pestilence: The New Orleans Yellow Fever Epidemic of 1853* (1996) John Duffy provides a medical account of yellow fever, focusing on the medical practices of the 1850s. Duffy traces the slow pace of the crisis and the anguish of a city decimated by the disease. He uses medical reports and newspaper accounts of the epidemic, the quartiles of the city council on sanitation, and various medical opinions from the local doctors. Duffy's research exposes the uncertainty of the medical community about where the epidemic might strike next. Although Duffy's work is an interesting narrative of the epidemic, it does not use modern scholarship to give a better understanding of the medical study of yellow fever.

The port of New Orleans was home to disorder long before the arrival of yellow fever. The port city was a thriving place of commerce, which brought in people from all over the world. Benjamin Trask's *Fearful Ravages: Yellow Fever in New Orleans, 1796-1905* highlights the city's propensity for disease and disorder. Trask addresses the city's sanitary conditions, which always worsened during the summer months. Trask mentions that the disorder stemmed from the government and their lack of focus on the sanitary conditions of the city and residents' disposal of waste. The late-eighteenth and early-nineteenth centuries were typified by an extremely high mortality rate because of yellow fever. Trask provides a sketch of the disease through the 109 years it affected New Orleans. Throughout the book, Trask discusses the demographics of the

people of New Orleans, analyzing the city's population in a social and economic context. Throughout his analysis, Trask uses primary sources from several repositories in New Orleans, including the archives of the Archdiocese of New Orleans, to support his thesis. Although Trask uses the Archdiocesan archives, he does not mention the disease's effects on the Catholic Church or the work of the Church focused on alleviating the suffering and managing burials among its congregations. Rather, his work provides a broad knowledge of the effects of yellow fever on the New Orleans.

New Orleans has been through many disasters since its founding, including the 1788 fire, which destroyed half of the city, and Hurricane Katrina, which hit the city in 2005. Geographer Richard Campanella's 2016 article, "Disaster and Response in an Experiment Called New Orleans, 1700s – 2000s," focuses on the various disasters that have struck New Orleans since its founding, including the yellow fever epidemics and their reach throughout the city. This geographic approach shows that yellow fever affected some parts of the city greater than others. Campanella argues that yellow fever was fostered by the manipulation of the natural environment, like sewerage and standing water. In his 2017 essay "August Exodus," Campanella also connects today's annual hurricane season to the nineteenth century's yellow fever outbreaks. This brief article gives a broad overview of the mass exodus that would occur yearly when the first case of yellow fever had been seen in New Orleans. The statistics demonstrate the class-based response to disaster in the city: those who can afford to, leave the city and those who are poor remain in place and in harm's way.

Those who were destined to stay in New Orleans during the 1853 outbreak were mainly poor Catholics, placing a special burden on the Catholic Church to care for them. Non-natives, especially Irish immigrants, saw the worst of the ravages of yellow fever in New Orleans. In his

article, "Getting Out of the Crescent City: Irish Immigration and the Yellow Fever Epidemic of 1853," (2011) Patrick Brennan connects the experience of the New Orleans poor during Katrina to the Irish immigrants stranded during the 1853 epidemic. This article explains that the Irish were treated similarly to low-income African Americans in 2005, and were so greatly affected by the epidemic because of poverty. Brennan's argument supports the need for more careful examination of the role and effects of the fever on the Catholic Church and the newly arrived Irish immigrants who had come to New Orleans to find a new and better life for themselves.

The most recent yellow-fever scholarship is Urmi Willoughby's *Yellow Fever, Race, and Ecology in Nineteenth-Century New Orleans* (2017). Willoughby analyzes how responses to the disease grew out of an environment shaped by sugar production, slavery, and urban development. Willoughby traces the origin of the yellow fever epidemic in New Orleans, focusing on public health campaigns that were conducted in the city. She also mentions the research that was done in the early 1900s to eliminate yellow fever in New Orleans. Willoughby brings new insights to the study of yellow fever by comparing the fever's movement in New Orleans to its effects throughout the history of the Atlantic World.

* * * * * * * *

Erasmus Fenner and Edward Barton are two firsthand accounts of the 1853 yellow fever epidemic in New Orleans. In 1854, just one year after the blight, Erasmus Fenner published *History of the Epidemic Yellow Fever, at New Orleans, Louisiana in 1853*. Fenner, a physician at Charity Hospital, compiled newspaper coverage of the epidemic, the weather conditions for the year of 1853, the sanitary conditions of New Orleans, the commencement of the epidemic in the city, and the hospital cases in the city. He recounts yellow fever coming from the ships, the internment numbers in the cemeteries of the cities, and the staggering 6,449 deaths in three

months. All of these sections provide primary-source material and anecdotes to better understand the conditions of New Orleans at the time.

In 1856, Edward Barton published his work, *The Cause, and Prevention of Yellow Fever at New Orleans and Other Cities in America*, as an answer to the public's questions regarding sanitary conditions in New Orleans. Barton investigates the conditions that caused and influenced the severity of the 1853 yellow fever epidemic. His work offers an insight into contemporary thought based on the limited information available at the time. When writing this argument, Barton's information on the city's sanitary reports gives a sharp picture of the horrid sanitary conditions in New Orleans at that time.

Methodology

Catholic burial records are commonly referred to as "cemetery day books." They are typically in ledger form, organized by date of death. Each entry notes the deceased's name, age, cause of death, place of origin, and racial classification. Therefore, an analysis of the day books can reveal a number of insights. For instance, it is possible to determine from the sample from St. Patrick's cemetery the number of deceased who were born in Ireland versus those born in New Orleans, the average age of those who died as well as their gender, and the variety of names used to describe the disease, particularly during the early stages of the epidemic. This information illuminates the day-to-day impact of the epidemic and the long history of the cemetery.

While proper analysis can lead to new knowledge at the macro level, it is also possible to see the stories of individuals and families through the burial records. Catherine Peterson, aged 26 and born in Ireland, and her one-year-old daughter, also named Catherine, born in New Orleans, both died on July 29th. Three of the Brosnehan children—aged three to seven years—perished on August 9th. This level of detail demonstrates not only the effects of the epidemic on the city's population but also upon the individual families, many of whom were recent arrivals to New Orleans. To create a searchable document from the day books I created an excel spreadsheet to record all of the identifying information for each of the deceased as well as their birthplace and cause of death. From this spreadsheet I was able to calculate those born abroad and specifically those born in Ireland. Yellow fever was listed as the cause of death for 850 of the 1,035 deaths recorded in St. Patrick Cemetery during the month of August (See Appendix 1).²⁰

Design

I have developed this proposal in concert with the sponsoring institution for this exhibit, the Archdiocese of New Orleans Office of Archives and Records, where I work as a research archivist. Their mission statement and protocols for exhibitions, therefore, frames *La Fièvre Jaune* and its design. According to the Archives, their mission is "to document and care for the historical records, publications, manuscript collections, and related records documenting the Catholic experience in Louisiana." The Archives also has specific guidelines for the creation of their exhibits, organization of the interpretive panels, and the information that is provided. In order to speak to a broad audience, the guidelines state that the wording on the interpretive panels should be no more than 250 words and should be between a fifth-grade and eighth-grade reading level. The specific guidelines that are provided allow the exhibit to be relevant to school children and adults who sojourn the museum.

The exhibit will chronicle the Church's response to the 1853 epidemic, complementing the death and burial records from the Archdiocese with photographs, correspondence, illustrations, and artifacts. One room within the Old Ursuline Convent and Museum will be dedicated to the presentation of *La Fièvre Juane*. This room will consist of four interpretive panels, two display cases, and a video monitor on which to display a brief video about the history of the New Orleans Catholic Cemeteries. The interpretive panels will provide the viewer with a description of the origin of the fever, the Mortuary Chapel, and the impact on the Irish immigrants buried in St. Patrick Cemetery. After the completion of the exhibit, the project will be digitally sustained as a virtual exhibit.

During the gathering of materials, a group of expert advisors will be entrusted to help develop, implement and evaluate the research and design of the project. Within this project there are two advisory groups: curators and historians at the Archdiocese of New Orleans and historians at the University of New Orleans. These groups will offer guidance and feedback on research methods, design tools, and other scholarly and public-facing work needed for the project.




Figure 1. Interpretive panel with title of exhibit, background is Edward Barton's 1853 map depicting the location of sanitary conditions of the city.

The History of La Fievre Jaune The yellow fever virus is of West African origin, carried by mosquitos-- Aedes aegypti--indigenous to that region. Brought to the Americas via ships carrying enslaved people, the disease arrived in Boston in 1693. After 1737, the fever hit eastern seaports sporadically into the nineteenth century. The virus reached New Orleans in 1796, killing at least 350 people. Between 1817 and 1905 there were at least forty-three outbreaks. The epidemic of 1853 was the most severe, with the loss of 8,000 souls.




Figure 3: This interpretive board gives the history of St. Anthony's Mortuary Chapel. It was built on the corner of Rampart and Conti, the chapel served as a burial chapel for the victims of yellow fever in New Orleans.




Figure 4: This final interpretive panel provides the history of St. Patrick Cemetery, the images shown on the panel are from St. Patrick's Cemetery and taken by the Katherine Vest.

New Orleans in 1853

Between 1850 and 1860, the population of New Orleans grew by over 50,000 to total nearly 170,000 people. Much of this growth came from the influx of immigrants to the city. Most of these came from Ireland, France, and Germany. This growth also contributed to the size of the Catholic population in the city.

Impact

La Fièvre Jaune was created to present the impact of yellow fever on the citizens of New Orleans, specifically the Irish immigrants, using Sacramental Records as the primary source. The importance of the Sacramental Records kept by the Catholic Church is one hold hundreds of years of information within their pages. A ramble through the sacramental registers is like a reunion of New Orleans families and a front-row seat to Louisiana's family histories. These old registers give a glimpse into the narrative of the masses, from the affluent leaders to the poor and the enslaved.

The Catholic Cemetery records have many scholarly uses, but they are also used as a way for the public to discover the burial sites of family members. Some of the records also give other information, such as a place of origin, age at the time of death, cause of death, and location of death. The information held within the records helps genealogists and historians by providing not only the basic information on the individual people mentioned, as well as medical history, social history, and urban life in Antebellum New Orleans. The goal of this project is to give the public input into the way the Catholic Church reacted to the yellow fever epidemic of 1853.

This project shows the importance of the Sacramental Records, but also educates the public about the sacredness of the cemeteries and the burials of the victims. The education provided by this exhibit reaches further than just the cemeteries; the project gives a history of the Irish, St. Patrick Church and Cemetery, and the loss of population from the fever. Specifically this project can have an overarching impact on the visitor of the museum.

Audience, Dissemination, and Relevance

In the context of the larger proposed exhibit, *Song of Farewell*, will be created to be relevant to as many individuals as possible. The exhibit is written within a fifth-grade reading level, which allows it to be understood by all visitors. The topic of New Orleans cemeteries is interesting to both visitors and citizens of New Orleans alike. Many of the citizens and communities are deeply dedicated to the upkeep and protection of the cemeteries. For the proposed exhibit, *Song of Farewell*, the Office of Archives and Records will work together with Save Our Cemeteries and other tour groups to promote the rich history of the cemeteries. The information produced throughout the exhibit will add to the city's extremely popular cemetery tours, especially St. Patrick Cemetery.

Other important groups who could have interest in the exhibit are; decedents of the Irish Immigrants, those studying the history of New Orleans during antebellum era, and even those students who take Louisiana History in middle school. The relevance of this exhibit is to provide the public with historical access to the history of yellow fever and St. Patrick cemetery, it is wide reaching in its ability to educate over many different topics and specified subject areas.

To help diversify the proposed exhibit, iPads will be placed around the rooms. We hope to connect them to the Save Our Cemetery site and the New Orleans Catholic Cemeteries webpage. Both sites include more information on the cemeteries throughout the city, and also offer ways to search for burials in all of the cemeteries located throughout the city. The hopeful partnership between these organizations will bring in an audience from all areas of the city to visit the museum.

Emphasis will be placed on the sacredness of the cemeteries, with quotes from music, burial rites and funeral liturgies. With photographs, letters, art, relics and incredibly preserved artifacts, the exhibit explores the rich history of the Catholic cemeteries of New Orleans.
